A Five Star Plan is a member driven satisfaction rating survey. Many may have zero premiums in addition to excellent coverage's. Individuals give an overall performance rating between 1 and 5, 5 Stars is excellent. Star Ratings can change every year. 5 Star Plans are identified by a special star icon.

The benefit of a 5 Star rating gives a Medicare Advantage subscriber the additional ability to switch to a 5 Star Plan once yearly between December 8 and November 30th. If you transfer to a Medicare Advantage Plan that includes prescription drug coverage to a standalone Prescription Drug Plan, you will be disenrolled from your Medicare Advantage Plan, including the Health benefit. You will be automatically returned to Original Medicare for your health services. An individual can only switch to a 5 Star Plan if one is available in your area.

In 2020 there were only 20, 5 Star Rated Medicare Advantage Plans in Florida. Ratings can change every October prior to the Annual Enrollment Period. There is much to consider when enrolling in a Medicare Advantage or Medicare Supplement Plan. It can be confusing, it is recommended to consult with a knowledgeable Medicare Professional who can answer your questions and guide you.
